- 4. Develop an outline (you may use topic, sentence, or Inspiration software for cluster outline)
- 5. Research your topic.
- 6. Annotate notes to be submitted with both first and final drafts.
- 7. Compile Works Cited page using two primary and two literary sources.
- 8. Peer review using checklist.
- 9. Revise.
- 10. Submit two copies of your first draft in a folder labeled with your name and include all notes, outline, and Works Cited page.
- 11. Revise.
- 12. Submit two copies of your final draft in a folder labeled with your name and include all notes, outline, and first draft.

#### Essential Questions for Interdisciplinary Research Paper Choose One

Ouestion and topic choice are due:

1. How is the American Dream a myth for some members of our society?

Narrow your focus to one group during one period or significant event.

2. What enables an individual to attain the American Dream?

Focus on qualities needed and evidence of attaining the dream for an individual or a specific group.

3. How have we demonstrated our core values as Americans?

Focus on a key value or two demonstrating evidence from American activities, actions, laws, etc.

4. How has music, poetry, prose,  $\underline{or}$  journalism been used to influence political and/or societal ideas  $\underline{or}$  values?

Focus on a particular period and connect the music, poetry, prose, or journalism to specific political or societal issues.

5. What are the aspects of a defining societal issue, and how does it reshape the course of history?

Focus on one defining issue from one period. Be sure to discuss the changes it sparked. These are some of the topics you might choose to answer through your essential question. Choose one.

#### Question #1

What I want to say about McCarthyism is that the myth of the American dream of freedom of expression and protection from tyranny was clearly demonstrated when falsity, fear, and the Red Scare caused the entertainment industry to face an unfair reality of censorship that changed our artistic history.

Now, get rid of the sentence stem and clean up your statement. Remember your thesis should be "a single declarative sentence that states the controlling idea of your research paper" (Goldenberg 70).

McCarthyism underscores the myth that freedom of expression and protection from oppression are guaranteed rights embodied in the American Dream. Deceptiveness and political corruption stripped away those guarantees in the entertainment industry through fear-based censorship.

These are difficult to write. You must spend some time writing and rewriting. You must do some research first to define where you think you'll go with your paper.
